FLOW Roll Clinic

Free Safety Clinic

FLOW and GWC will offer a special 2-hour introductory river safety clinic for FLOW members on Wednesday, September 18 from 6pm to 8pm at Lock 32 Whitewater Park. The goal is prevent you from becoming a statistic. The GWC instructional staff will present basic hand signals, water dynamics, swimming /wading in moving water, preparation, prevention, safety and rescue skills. If you paddle on or around moving water you need these skills and you have the prerequisites. The course is free to FLOW members and no pre-registration is required.

Ohiopyle Falls Race and Freestyle





Kayaker Drowns On Esopus Creek

This message is forwarded for two reasons. First, to ask to help this family recover from their tragic loss and second, to warn of the strainer danger.

As many of you already know KCCNY member Larry Kerwin lost his life on Saturday morning, July 20'th after falling into a strainer on the upper Esopus Creek while paddling with the AMC. Other NY/North Jersey AMC paddlers on the trip report that Larry made no apparent effort to paddle away from the strainer as he approached it. His kayak flipped and he went under rapidly.

For those unfamiliar with this "feature", it was a mass of tangled trees and debris river-right on the outside of a bend not far from the portal put-in. It was generally considered easily avoidable by most paddlers, but regrettably, was not for Larry, nor for Nicole Coppelino, the girl who lost her life in the same strainer about a month earlier while tubing.

A few strong and capable AMC members bravely struggled for 10 minutes Saturday morning to extricate Larry from the strainer and promptly initiated CPR. Soon after, local EMTs arrived and took over, but it was too late.

Larry is survived by a wife and three children. Mourning his loss, KCCNY has set up a fund for Larry's family. Please consider sending a donation, what ever the amount, to help this young family. Kayakers are a close knit group, now is the time for us to come together to help this family recover from their tragic loss.

Open Letter To FLOW from Steve Bergere

You enter the water, you enter the food chain, and not always at the top.

I was invited to Stoneys Campgrounds by a couple of kayaker friends of mine on August 10, 2002. I arrived early, about 12:30 in the afternoon, met Mike Stone, and he directed me to the spot where my friends would most likely be, around site # 48. "Just follow the FLOW signs and you'll find them."

The site was easy enough to find, however my friends were nowhere to be seen. Just as well, they were probably out on the river risking life and limb and having a blast. I set up a couple of folding chairs, a little table, two small coolers and draped a weathered American Flag over the window of my car, all underneath a small shade tree. I settled down into a MossyOak chair, kicked my boots off, propped my feet up, and looked around.

Behind me was a nice, very well shaded camp site with a sign taped to a tree which read "Reserved for Kathy". To the right of her site were a couple of tents, including a very large tent (I found out later that this was Mike's tent) and a whole bunch of tube aluminum folding chairs. (similar to Coleman or MossyOak stuff). I smiled as I thought that, all that was needed was a "For Sale" sign.

As the day wore on and people (kayakers) started to arrive back at their sites, I had the sinking feeling that I might be in the wrong place, that I might be intruding. The feeling quickly left as Mike, Don and Dave (the Turkey cook) introduced themselves. I explained that I was looking for a couple of friends, and that Stoney said that they would be around site # 48. I was no longer sure that I was in the right place. Mike said no problem, that if I did not find my friends, I was welcome to stay and party with them.

Steve Kittleberger came by and introduced himself, as I did likewise, and I explained what was going on. I realized by this time that I was in the wrong area and I should probably leave, not meaning to intrude, as an uninvited guest. Steve would hear nothing of it and suggested that I stay, perhaps my friends would wander by.

I met Lori, Jerry, Mike, Don, Steve, Kathy, Dave and a host of others whose names have been filed away in the deep, dark recesses of what used to be my mind. (yes, I spent 4 years as a college student)

I was asked, time and again, to come down to the cooking area and have some dinner, but being somewhat shy and nervous, I politely declined.

The world should take lessons from Kathy and Jerry and Lori and Mike and all the rest of you, in friendship, hospitality and making a stranger feel welcome and at ease.

I would like to see you all again, next time, if I live long enough. I would like to sample Dave's turkey and have one of Mike's lime flavored beers.

By the way, it turns out that my friends were there, and had a tent set up 50 or so yards to the left of Kathy's reserved site. They were late getting off of the river, had break problems with the RV and were late getting back to the camp grounds. My friend (Mike Kelley), who I was to meet, said that I should have mentioned that I was looking for the "guys who rented and set up a hot tub" a while back.

I missed them by moments at the bonfire, and as I walked back to my car, flashlight in hand, I passed two people in the dark on the road, who were late getting to the fire.

I was inches from them and never saw them.


